Year 7 Transition Survey Results

- Thank you to all pupils and parents/carers who completed our Transition survey. We use the results to
 monitor our provision and ensure pupils are supported in their transition from primary to secondary
 school, which can be daunting for some.
- I would like to share just a few highlights with you. The results were overwhelmingly positive, thank you.
- Pupils state they love:
 - learning new things
 - being challenged
 - making new friends
 - having fun on the yard and whilst learning
 - working independently
 - being more independent
 - teachers being helpful
 - o chances to do lot of different things in lessons and outside of lessons
 - how big the school is
 - sporting activities
 - extracurricular activities
 - love choosing their own food from a range of options
- Of the parents that completed the questionnaire 97.3% said they know who their child can talk to if they
 are worried. If you do not please contact us as we have really strong routines in place to support pupils
 and families.
- Some pupils and parents found the shift to having homework in a greater range of subjects a challenge. We will continue to focus on this in the wider curriculum programme in Half term 1 for pupils.
- Finding their way around a large school can be difficult for some of our pupils I can relate to that! Staff stand on the threshold of their classrooms every lesson and we have pupils and staff helping pupils get to where they need to be to help alleviate this worry.


