Year 13 Examinations, Leavers' Information & Key Dates

Examinations

For all students [other than those studying a T Level], A-level and vocational examinations begin on **Thursday 1st May**. Students have already received individual timetables, and the full exam schedule is available here: [Examinations Timetable](#)

- Morning exams begin at 9:00am and afternoon exams at 1:00pm, unless otherwise stated.
- Students should arrive at least 15 minutes before the start of each exam.
- They will assemble in designated exam preparation rooms and be escorted to exam venues.
- In case of lateness or absence, please call reception immediately on 0191 4990111.

Students must ensure they are in full uniform and fully equipped with pens, pencils, rulers, calculators etc. Conduct and consideration for others remains paramount during the exam period.



Examination Contingency Dates

All students must remain available up to and including the following contingency dates, in case of unforeseen national or local disruptions:

- Wednesday 11th June [pm]
- Wednesday 25th June [am and pm]

Revision and Support

During the examination season, Year 13 students should attend scheduled revision sessions, 1:1 subject support, and supervised study sessions where needed. Teachers and Sixth Form staff remain available to help with final preparations—please encourage your child to seek support when needed.

Leavers' Mass

Year 13 Leavers' Mass will take place on **Monday 19th May**. This will be followed by a short celebration in the Sixth Form Centre. Year 13 lessons will resume after lunch.

Study Leave

All Year 13 students will be granted study leave from **Monday 2nd June**. This means that for all students, their last full day of timetabled lessons will be **Friday 23rd May**.

Any student with an external examination scheduled before this date is entitled to one day of study leave prior to their exam. We encourage students to use this time effectively for preparation. While study leave is granted, we strongly recommend that students continue to take advantage of the study spaces available at school. In some cases, it may still be beneficial for students to attend timetabled lessons, even if they have permission to be on study leave.

While on study leave, students are still expected to attend any revision sessions or exam warm-up activities arranged by their subject teachers, as these are designed to support their preparation and boost confidence ahead of exams.



A-Level Results Day

Results will be available from the Sixth Form Centre from 8:30am on **Thursday 14th August 2025**.

- Students should collect results in person. Results cannot be given by phone or email.
- If a student wishes results to be posted, please provide a stamped, self-addressed envelope (labelled "A-Level Results") to Mr Tait by Monday 14th July 2025.
- For exceptional cases, please contact the Sixth Form team using the email below.

Next Steps & Support with Destinations

On Results Day, students will have the opportunity to meet with members of the Sixth Form and Senior Leadership Teams to discuss next steps—whether confirming university places, exploring apprenticeships, or entering employment.
